
ESASMUS ROBOTICS TRIP TO MURCIA


NEWS FROM YEARS 1-6

Here is some news about this term from classes 1-6. Ms Angie has sent an Early Years newsletter separately with lots of information about Nursery and Reception.

Year 1

In Literacy this term, we have focused on retelling stories, writing letters and instructions using our key text 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We first used roleplay to immerse ourselves into the familiar story. We used masks and real props to help us make the story come alive. Then we focused on learning how to write instructions using time connectives and imperative verbs (also known as bossy words). It was great fun writing instructions on how to catch a porridge thief! We have also worked hard to improve our handwriting and letter formation.





In **Maths** this term, we have been learning about 2D shapes and 3D shapes. We were able to match the shapes to their names and describe their properties. We know that 3D shapes have faces, edges and vertices! This term we were introduced to multiplication and division through repeated addition and sharing. We found some of it tricky but we are getting better with practice. We used our counting skills to begin to develop understating of grouping and used concrete objects to support us with this. We have also

practiced measuring objects using informal units such a cubes and paper clips. We have learnt so much this term!

In **Science** this term, we have been learning about Plants. We first identified what a plant is the different features of a plant and their functions. We looked at garden plants, wild plants, and their differences. Then we made observations of growing plants by planting some of our own and watching how they change over time. This was fun as we were able to do our own investigation. We also had STEM week where we had to present our learning to the rest of the school and create an activity for others to take part in during the science fair!

In **Reading**, we have been using Bug Club to help with our reading during phonics. We also read every day first thing in the morning and have Story time at the end of the day where our teachers read aloud to us. We love listening to stories. This term we had World Book Day where we spent the whole day picking and choosing our favourite books and reading them. We even dressed up as our favourite story characters! The

whole school had a helpful assembly that gave us some great tips on how to pick out new books to read. We cannot wait to see what the next term will be like but we know it will be full of learning and fun!





In our **Literacy** lessons, Year 2 read lots of poetry about the senses. After listening to some fantastic poems by Pie Corbett, Year 2 recited and performed poetry about the senses from memory, before writing their own poems about the senses.

Year 2 have continued to improve their **Maths** skills by recalling the number facts to 20, knowing how to divide and multiply using the 2x, 5x and 10x multiplication tables and using different strategies for finding change and solving word problems. During the first half of Summer term, Year 2 have SAT's assessments to complete at school and have been practising in preparation for them.

On 3rd March 2023, Year 2 visited The Florence Nightingale Museum as part of our **History** topic. Whilst there, they were hosted by Florence Nightingale and had the pleasure of learning all about her life and achievements from her own mouth! Year 2 explored the different zones of the Florence Nightingale Museum, learning about Florence's home life, what the conditions and medical supplies were like when she worked in the military hospital and who her family were. Year 2 even saw Florence Nightingale's pet owl 'Athena', which had been stuffed and was on display at the museum.





In **Literacy** this half term we have been writing calligrams and shape poems. A calligram is a word or piece of text in which the design and layout of the letters creates a visual image related to the meaning of the words themselves. We really enjoyed writing shape poems about spring. We then performed our poems to the class and made sure to use loud clear voices, expression and actions whilst performing.

In **Maths** we have been learning about money. We have been counting money, using coins to make different amounts and have been adding money amounts together. We are now also working on finding change.



Our topic for **Science** has been 'Animals including humans'. We have been learning about nutrition and how to stay healthy. We learnt about the 5 food groups and the 7 types of nutrients. We found out that there are three different types of skeletons that animals can have; endoskeletons, exoskeletons and hydrostatic skeletons. We also looked and the human skeleton (which is an endoskeleton) and muscles. We even made our very own scientific models showing how arm muscles work.

In **History** we have been continuing with our topic on the Stone Age to the Iron Age. In class we created some Stonehenge art work using pastels and black sugar paper. It is believed that work started on the Stonehenge around 5000 year ago, and the final changes were made in the early bronze age.







In **Maths** we have been focusing on multiplication and division looking at mental strategies and written strategies. We are learning how to use these strategies to solve word problems. We are continuing to master all the times tables and, after half term, we will be entering an MTC Emile National Competition to help us hone our skills.

In **Literacy** we have revisited the 100 year 3,4 statutory spellings using Emile and other online spelling games to support this. Next term we will be looking at prefixes and suffixes - their meanings and how they affect the root word.

We read the amazing book The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane and we wrote our own short stories. To help us improve our writing we learnt about coordinating and subordinating conjunctions. We also focused on how to paragraph and the important rules around setting out dialogue.

We are now moving onto newspapers. Watch this space as year 4 will be producing their own newspapers to sell.

In **Geography**, we have been learning about the globe, lines of latitude and longitude and climate zones as well as the different continents. We will continue with this topic after Easter and then we'll start our history topic: Roman Britain.

In **Science** we have explored electricity and how electricity is made. We have learnt how to make circuits using various components. We looked at conductors and insulators and we made our own switches. We are taking part in The Great Battery Hunt and will be recycling our batteries after the



In **RE** we have learnt about Buddhism and we now learning about Christianity.


holiday. Our next topic will be Sound.

This term in **Maths** we are learning about fractions, decimals and percentages and we are now learning to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions.

In **Science** we are studying the life cycles of animals.

Two of our year 5 children recently travelled to Spain for a week as part of an Erasmus+ STEM via ROBOTICS Project and after Easter five children will travel to Istanbul to take part in Turkey's annual 23rd April Children Day dance Festival.

In **Literacy** we have been working on our new unit of Narrative writing. We have looked at how to write different parts of a story and what makes a story interesting. We looked at what to include in the opening, the build-up, dilemma, events, resolution and the ending. To help us with this, we looked at Mac's short adventure which helped us in planning and writing our own stories. The children produced some amazing stories.



In **PE** we have been playing Bash ball.

In **ICT** we have been using Emile to support us in our Literacy and Maths. This has helped children with their spelling and their Maths fluency.

Please do support your children in using this programme at home.

We also use Accelerated reader where children take quizzes on books that they have read to check understanding. Children should be reading for at least 30 minutes every day which improves brain connectivity, increases vocabulary and reading comprehension. Please do sign up to Accelerated Reader where you can check on your child's progress.

Whilst the second half of Spring Term has largely been focused on preparing the children for their SATs, we've also managed to fit in a great deal beyond. Team Six loved their trip to Tower Bridge and the workshop has set us up nicely for our Young City Poets poems on this fantastic structure. We also had an incredible experience at Kench Hill that you've all no doubt heard a great deal about.

In **Literacy**, our poetry skills have been developing nicely and we are looking forward to having a professional poet come in for a workshop that will help the children to refine their poems ahead of hopefully being chosen to be published in the book created by The National Literacy Trust.

In **Maths**, we have been focusing on fractions and algebra and will now concentrate our efforts on any areas many children might still be struggling with ahead of their SATs papers.

In Reading, it's been all about reading comprehension and helping the children to obtain and hone their skills in things like retrieval, decoding, summarizing and inference ahead of the SATs.

PSHE – We have been having some fantastic conversations in class about many forms of prejudice based on 'The Heartstone Odyssey' book we have been reading together and have lots more planned for this fantastic project.

Spanish – Team Six have been focusing on hobbies, and school objects/subjects.

P.E. – We have been focusing on throwing, running and jumping skills as part of our Athletics unit.

ICT – The class have been developing their skills with Microsoft Office tools such as Word by writing up their biographies and adding pictures. We are now using this information to create PowerPoint presentations on their chosen hero.

Please support the children as much as you can in preparing for the SATs, whether that be by ensuring they get a regular ten hours of sleep, doing homework or even extra practice at home. It's not long to go now and we need to make sure they are prepared and subsequently more at ease with the idea of doing their SATs papers.
