
Please make sure you have completed the application online and have received a confirmation email.

Nursery Class

What is in the bag... This half-term the Nursery have started a new mini project called: What's in the bag? as part of this project the Nursery class have dived into a book called 'Who is in the Egg?' by Alexandra Milton The Hook...This led to a visit to Morrison's to buy eggs. The children used their senses to explore the eggs. Most children learnt that there are different coloured eggs and different animals can live in eggs.

They explored hot, cold, sticky, dark and learnt new words such as oval, massive, enormous, swamp, desert, yolk and

The Nursery spoke about their own families, which was linked to baby animals who also have families.

Throughout the project, children went on an oval hunt and sorted 2d shapes by names and their properties.

Information books and video clips were used to encourage further talk and develop children's knowledge and understanding of the following: penguins and ostriches.

This month we have been learning through our focus books 'The Paper Dolls', 'The Great Paper Caper' and the story 'Clean up' about a very spirited and courageous character, Rocket.

We have had many discussions about the paper dolls story, characters and main plot. We have drawn and painted beautiful pictures about the story and written captions to accompany our pictures.

Discussions around the story led us to thinking about paper and where it comes from. We then delved into finding out a little more about recycling- why it is important and where it goes! We spoke about the 3 R's-Reduce, Reuse and Recycle and the children have been great at sorting the recycled materials and reusing it to make and create!

In the story 'The Great Paper Caper', a bear learns the value of paper, where it comes from and how to reuse it to make more. We were inspired by this to make our own paper and we had a pulping time!
