




SCIENCE WEEK

INTERNET SAFETY

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote at Holmleigh Primary School. Young Hackney's health and wellbeing team ran a workshop on online safety during parents' evening. There will be another workshop in the autumn term. If you have any concerns or questions about keeping your child safe online, please do get in touch with your child's class teacher or myself.

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

- 1. How can I stay safe while using the Internet?
- Use websites that are mainly for children.
- Share your password with your friends.
- Avoid using the Internet.
- Share your personal information.
- 2. Your friends have been talking about a game they have been playing online. You find a website where you can download the game. A pop-up appears on your screen suggesting that you click on it to download the game for free.

What should you do?

- Ask your friends what to do; they have been playing the game so they should know the answer.
- Show the pop-up to a trusted adult and ask them if it is safe for you to click to download the game.

ZONES OF REGULATION

Zones of Regulations helps children and adults to identify and name how they are feeling, recognise how others might feel and have a set of tools to help them to regulate emotions.

We are introducing the Zones through discrete teaching lessons and through our PSHE curriculum. We will also be using the Zones language as part of daily school life so all staff will be referring to them, not just their class teacher.

SPANISH PARTNESHIP VISIT TO HOLMLEIGH MARCH 4th - 8th 2024

Following on from our recently completed **ROBOTICS ERASMUS** + **Project**, we recently enjoyed a week long visit to Holmleigh by our Spanish partners from **Susarte School** in Murcia, Spain.

This was the third visit to Holmleigh by this school over the past 4 years, and was made

possible because of the close ties we have kept with former Erasmus + Partners. The group of 2 teachers and 5 Spanish students (who stayed with Holmleigh families) enjoyed a fantastic week of visits and activities. All the Holmleigh host children took part in every activity.



Tuesday - Welcome Assembly and tour of the school, followed by a Robotics workshop, then off to central London for a long walking tour of all the sights, culminating in a restaurant meal in a burger restaurant near London Bridge.

Wednesday - We drove to Cambridge in the school minibus and enjoyed a beautiful day visiting the colleges, the river and the shopping streets, including a short tour of Peterhouse.

Thursday - A Robotics challenge in school with a demonstration assembly for Year 6. Then off the central London again, followed by a few hours in Camden Market. Then, back at school courtesy of Chef Darwing, a wonderful Paella Meal and a Quiz Night!

Friday - We spent the morning playing tennis and football in Springfield Park, before saying a tearful farewell to our new dear friends! We said goodbye with the promise of an invite to return the visit to Murcia in the Autumn of this year.

Thanks to everyone who enabled the visit to happen, especially the host families who looked after our guests so well. We look forward to more opportunities in future to maintain and develop our international partner activities for the benefit of Holmleigh children

- Kindness




