That is all about to change with a trip to Kench Hill in the first week back after the half-term holidays, bikeability and canoeing and biking all coming up. We will also be going to Hackney Town Hall for a

celebration of their work and discussions about racial hatred, gender inequality and other issues as part of our Heartstone Odyssey project.
