

We have had a very busy start to the academic year, learning lots of new things! In Literacy, we read the book 'The Dark' by Lemony Snicket. We thought of different adjectives to describe the dark and wrote letters to Laszlo to give him advice on how not to be afraid of the dark. We also explored the dark and learnt about different types of nocturnal animals. We read the book 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon, and created our own 'lost' posters for Beegu so that she could be found again. We have now started our new topic: 'instructions' and had a go at making some delicious cupcakes! We will now be writing up our instructions of how to make them!



In **Maths**, we have been practising counting, recognising and writing numbers. We have been ordering and comparing numbers using the words 'greater than' and 'less than'. We have also been practising using number lines and finding one more and one less than a number. We have been putting objects into two groups in different ways and have also learnt how to use a part-whole model.



Our topic for **Science** this half term has been 'seasonal changes'. We learnt about the four seasons and the changes that take place in each season. We really enjoyed going out for a walk to see the changes around us for autumn. We spotted some trees with leaves turning yellow and orange, and we found that the tree in our school playground had sycamore seeds. We also noticed that the weather was quite warm and learnt that the weather can vary at the beginning of autumn.







In **History** we have been learning about 'My Family History'. We have been having lost of discussions about our grandparents and what we think life was like when they were children. We talked about what school might have been like for them and the toys they may have played with. We agreed that their toys may have been quite different from ours and that they probably didn't have ipads and Nintendo switches!
