#### NUMBER DAY



#### SAFER INTERNET DAY

This year, Safer Internet Day was held on Tuesday 11th February. Safer Internet Day highlights a new theme each year that addresses the challenges and experiences children and young people face online. This year's theme was: 'Too Good to Be True? Protecting Yourself and Others from Scams Online.'

The focus was on understanding online scams, learning how young people can protect themselves and others, and raising awareness of the support available to them.

There was also a session for parents and carers focused on staying safe online, which was led by Young Hackney.

Snapchat's family center; Family Center helps parents get more insight into who their kids are friends with on Snapchat, and who they have been communicating with, while still respecting their childs' privacy and autonomy. It's designed to reflect the way parents engage with their kids in the real world, where parents usually know who their children are friends with and when they are hanging out, but don't eavesdrop on their private conversations. Family Center will provide parents the ability to:
  - See which Snapchat friends their teens have sent messages, photos, or videos to in the last seven days, in a way that still protects their privacy by not revealing the actual contents of their conversations (Snaps and messages)
  - See a complete list of their teens' existing friends, and allow parents to easily view new friends their teens' existing friends, and allow parents to easily view new friends their teens have added, making it easy to start
  - conversations about who their new contacts areLimit their teen's ability to view certain content in the Stories and Spotlight
  - Easily and confidentially report any accounts parents may be concerned about directly to our 24/7 Trust and Safety team.
- 5. Tiktoks family pairing allows a parent to link their TikTok account to their child's and set parental controls including: daily screen time, mute push notifications, filter video keywords (excludes words or hashtags), restricted Mode (restrict your exposure to content that may not be appropriate or suitable), direct Messages (restrict who can send messages, or turn off direct messaging completely) and control comments (decide who can comment on your teen's videos).

## and being on time means not missing out

A reminder that the school gates open at 8.50am and all children should be in the playground ready for the morning exercise at 8.55. We will close the gates on Holmleigh Road at 9.00am.

Please make every effort to arrive at school on time. If your child arrives later than 9:00 am, please report to the Main Reception Office, where you will be asked to sign in and provide a reason for their late arrival.

Arriving at school on time every day helps your child be ready for learning and ensures they don't miss valuable learning opportunities. Thank you for your cooperation!

## ATTENDANCE

The government has set a target of 95% attendance for all pupils. The whole school attendance for this half term 95.8%. School attendance is central to raising standards in education and ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential. Please remember that <u>we do not authorise holidays in term time</u> and unauthorised absences may result in a fixed penalty notice being issued.

If your child is going to be absent from school, it is important to contact the school on the first date of the absence to inform us of the reasons. If this continues for more than one day, you should make contact with the school on a daily basis to keep us updated.

### Some key attendance facts:

Attending 90% of the time or less will have a serious effect on learning. One day's absence every two weeks will give 90% attendance. Up to the age of 16, 90% attendance will mean losing over a year of school - more than half.
