
A huge thank you to our wonderful children, who continue to embody The Holmleigh Way and make this such a special school.


The Leavers' Party was a joyful celebration; full of delicious food, fantastic and wonderful memories made.



PRE-LOVED UNIFORM


We have a supply of pre-loved uniform at school. Please speak with a member of staff at the school office.

ATTENDANCE

Thank you all for your continued support in helping us meet our school attendance target and for ensuring that children arrive on time each day.

Our whole school attendance for this academic year is 95.4%, which is slightly lower than last year's figure.

We want to remind everyone that attending school every day makes a real difference to your child's learning, progress, and well-being. Please remember that we do not authorise holidays during term time, and unauthorised absences may result in a fixed penalty notice being issued.

If your child is going to be absent from school, it is important that you contact the school on the first day of the absence to inform us of the reasons. If this continues for more than one day, you should make contact with the school on a daily basis to keep us updated.


