We look forward to welcoming you back on Wednesday 7th January 2026.



MURAL PROJECT

We are excited to share details of a special project taking place during the spring term at Holmleigh Primary School. As part of our commitment to building strong relationships within our newly merged school community, we have secured funding from Hackney Education to transform areas of the school into a meaningful masterpiece that celebrates our vibrantly diverse community.

This project will bring pupils, families, and staff together to create a large-scale mural that reflects our shared identities, backgrounds, and aspirations.

The project will be led by Rose Hill, Summer's mum and the founder of Co-Creation Connection.

Our Goals

- Community Collaboration: Pupils in Years 2-6, along with families and staff, will work together to plan, design, and create the mural, showcasing our diverse backgrounds and dreams.
- Celebration of Diversity: The mural will reflect the richness of our community within a safe, welcoming, and inclusive space.
- Belonging and Pride: By working together, we aim to foster a strong sense of teamwork, pride, and belonging.
- Lasting Impact: The finished mural will continue to promote positivity, connection, and wellbeing long after the project is complete.

What We'll Do

- Creative Workshops: Workshops for pupils in Years 2-6 will take place on 23rd February, 27th February, 2nd March, and 6th March.
- Pupils will take part in activities such as creating mood boards, exploring colours and patterns, selecting colour palettes, and discussing what is important for the mural.
- Co-Design: Rose Hill, a professional artist, will guide the design process to ensure the mural is visually striking and meaningful.

- Let's Paint!: Following the design stage, a selection of pupils, families, staff, and local artists will come together to paint the mural on 27th, 28th, and 30th March.
- Big Reveal: We will celebrate the completed mural with a special event for the school and local community, giving everyone involved the chance to feel proud of their contribution.
- Continuing the Journey: After the mural is completed, we will create a video documenting the project, ensuring the mural remains a lasting symbol of our community.

AMPLIFIED SCHOOLS

We are delighted to share that from January we will be celebrating our wonderful school community even more widely. Following the success of our recent merger and the many fantastic achievements taking place in classrooms every day, this is the perfect time to shine a brighter light on our pupils' creativity, achievements, and wider school life. We will be working with Amplified Schools to support this work.


CLASS SHARE SESSIONS

BUY AN APPLE, GIVE AN APPLE INITIATIVE

We are delighted to be taking part in the 'Buy an apple, Give an apple' initiative, a community-led project focused on making fresh, nutritious food more accessible to children while reducing food waste.

The initiative is run by Streetbox, a local food organisation that works directly with growers and London's produce markets to rescue good-quality surplus fruit that might otherwise go to waste. Through partnerships with local businesses and schools, these apples are redistributed so that more children can enjoy a healthy snack during the school day.



This project also forms part of a wider movement for a fairer and more sustainable food system, linked to a programme called **Bloom Market**, which explores new ways for communities to buy and share food while supporting growers and reducing waste.

We are very grateful to Dash's dad for introducing this opportunity to Holmleigh, and we are excited to be part of a project that supports both children's wellbeing and a better food system.

PUNCTUALITY

Every Day Counts and being on time means not missing out

A reminder that the school gates open at 8:50am and all children should be in the playground ready for morning exercise, which will begin at 8:55am alongside the rest of the school after the Christmas break. The gates will close promptly at 9:05am.

Please make every effort to arrive at school on time. If your child arrives later than 9:05am, please report to the Main Reception Office, where you will be asked to sign in and provide a reason for their late arrival.

Arriving at school on time every day helps your child be ready for learning and ensures they don't miss valuable learning opportunities. Thank you for your cooperation!

ATTENDANCE

The government has set a target of 95% attendance for all pupils.

The whole school attendance for this half term was 93.41 School attendance is central to raising standards in education and ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential. Please remember that we do not authorise holidays in term time and unauthorised absences may result in a fixed penalty notice being issued.

If your child is going to be absent from school, it is important that you contact the school on the first day of the absence to inform us of the reasons. If this continues for more than one day, you should make contact with the school on a daily basis to keep us updated.

Our overall attendance this week was 92.5% which is significantly below our target of Some key attendance facts:

Attending 90% of the time or less will have a serious effect on learning.

One day's absence every two weeks will give 90% attendance.

Up to the age of 16, 90% attendance will mean losing over a year of school - more than half.
