CLUBS

We are pleased to share that we have extended our wraparound provision to include additional clubs for KS1. We hope the children are enjoying the opportunity to take part in these new activities.

After School Care Club runs from 3:30pm to 6:00pm.

After School Activity Clubs run from 3:30pm to 4:30pm, with the exception of Gymnastics and Science (KS2) which run until 5:30pm.

CHILDREN'S WELLBEING WEEK

During assemblies and class sessions, we reflected on what belonging means to them and identified the safe spaces where they feel supported and included.

SAFER INTERNET DAY

Each year, Safer Internet Day focuses on a different theme that reflects the challenges and experiences children and young people face online. This year's theme was: *Smart tech, safe choices - exploring the safe and responsible use of AI*.

During the day, we discussed the growing impact of AI on our lives, exploring how it can be used positively and responsibly. The children also received advice and guidance to help them make informed, safe choices when using AI and other online technologies.

There was also an Online Safety workshop for parents and carers on Wednesday 11th February, led by Young Hackney. The session provided helpful guidance and practical advice to support families in keeping children safe online.

MURAL PROJECT

This project will bring pupils, families, and staff together to create a large-scale mural that reflects our shared identities, backgrounds, and aspirations.

The project will be led by Rose Hill, Summer's mum and the founder of *Co-Creation Connection*.

What We'll Do

- **Creative Workshops:** Workshops for pupils in Years 2-6 will take place on 23rd February, 27th February, 2nd March, and 6th March.
- Pupils will take part in activities such as creating mood boards, exploring colours and patterns, selecting colour palettes, and discussing what is important for the mural.
- **Co-Design:** Rose Hill, a professional artist, will guide the design process to ensure the mural is visually striking and meaningful.
- **Let's Paint!** Following the design stage, a selection of pupils, families, staff, and local artists will come together to paint the mural on 27th, 28th, and 30th March.
- **Big Reveal:** We will celebrate the completed mural with a special event for the school and local community, giving everyone involved the chance to feel proud of their contribution.
- **Continuing the Journey:** After the mural is completed, we will create a video documenting the project, ensuring the mural remains a lasting symbol of our community.

PUNCTUALITY

Every Day Counts and being on time means not missing out

A reminder that the school gates open at 8.50am and all children should be in the playground ready for the morning exercise at 8.55. We will close the gates at 9.05am.

Please make every effort to arrive at school on time. If your child arrives later than 9:00 am, please report to the Main Reception Office, where you will be asked to sign in and provide a reason for their late arrival.

Arriving at school on time every day helps your child be ready for learning and ensures they don't miss valuable learning opportunities. Thank you for your cooperation!

ATTENDANCE

The government has set a target of 95% attendance for all pupils. Our whole-school attendance for this half term was 91.6%.

Good attendance is vital in raising educational standards and ensuring that every pupil is able to fulfil their potential. Regular attendance supports children's learning, confidence and wellbeing.

Please remember that holidays during term time will not be authorised, and unauthorised absences may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued in line with local authority guidance.

If your child is absent from school, you must contact the school on the first day of absence to inform us of the reason. If the absence continues for more than one day, please contact the school each day to keep us updated.

DISMISSAL AT THE END OF DAY
