





Five Animal Groups




In **History** we have been learning about the greatest explorers. We learnt about the lives of Ibn Battuta, Captain James Cook, Captain Robert Scott, Roald Amundsen and Sunita Williams. It has been fascinating to learn all about where they travelled to and why they were seen as great explorers. We learnt that the explorers each had different reasons for travelling and that they all had many great achievements. We studied timelines, photographs, diaries and maps to help us learn more about their lives.

This term in **Spanish**, we have been learning about colours, the numbers 1-10, the days of the week, the months of the year, and common greetings such as "How are you?" and "What is your name?"
